

Director of Athletics, Tompkins Cortland Community College

Mick McDaniel has degrees in Education from SUNY Cortland and Park & Recreation Administration from SUNY Delhi. He has been the Director of Athletics & Recreation at Tompkins Cortland Community College since 2000.

At "TC3", Mick has been a part of significant campus and programming growth. In 2007, the College opened the doors to a 25-million-dollar athletics facility that has hosted numerous Conference, Regional, State, and National Championships over the years. Under his leadership, TC3 has greatly expanded student offerings adding intercollegiate teams in baseball, men's lacrosse



and cross country. Mick has been honored with multiple coach of the year awards while leading several teams, including men's basketball, golf, men's lacrosse, and men's and women's soccer. His teams have won multiple championships, and he has coached national champions, All-Americans, and countless winners of individual honors.

Mick has held several offices on the regional and national level, including currently serving as the Chairman of the Board for the National Junior Athletic Association (NJCAA). Locally, Mick serves as the President of the Cortland Regional Sports Council. This group has brought over five million dollars in Sports Tourism revenue to the area in the past year alone.

Serving the community and area youth is a passion of Mick's, having created and been the director of Panthers Summer Sports Camps for 27 years and continued work with local and NY State athletics associations that come to campus each year for championship events.

Mick is married to his wife of 25 years, MaryBeth, and they have three sons Sean, Andrew, and Brendan. Mick and MaryBeth are incredibly proud that all three are graduates of TC3, studentathletes, and have moved on to four-year institutions.



Katrina Ricca, Watkins Glen

Katrina Ricca is a three-sport athlete at Watkins Glen who has demonstrated great leadership during her time with the Senecas. Ricca was one of only two seniors on the girls soccer team, and she led by example as a key defender to help such a young squad win the program's first-ever IAC and Section IV titles.

Ricca is also one of four seniors on the tennis team that went 8-1 during the regular season. She teamed up with her brother Max in doubles. Elsewhere, Ricca is part of the trap-shooting team and holds many important roles throughout the school, including Senior Class president, Ski Club vice president, and Wellness Club treasurer. Academically, Ricca is ranked #1 in her class with a 4.1 GPA and is a member of the National Society of High School Honors. She will be attending Nebraska University to study forensic science. Male Senior Leadership Award

Zach Taylor, Newfield

Zach Taylor is a three-sport athlete at Newfield who has exuded leadership qualities during his time with the Trojans. Taylor was the captain of the boys soccer team. He has made a lasting mark, being on the varsity team for five years and is the all-time leading scorer in program history.



This season, he was named the IAC South Small Division Co-MVP. The senior was also a captain of the boys basketball team and played a key part in last season's state championship. This season, Taylor helped the Trojans win another IAC South Small Division title and was named an IAC All-Star. In the spring, Taylor was part of the track and field team, competing in multiple events and making state qualifiers last year. Academically, Taylor is ranked first in his class with a 99.82 GPA and is a member of the National Honor Society. He will be attending SUNY Cortland for a degree in education and wants to come back to Newfield to teach math or science. Coach of the Year in a Girls Sport



Andy Kalet, Union Springs

The IAC continues to produce dominant girls basketball teams, and that carried into this season with Union Springs, led by head coach Andy Kalet. In his fifth season at the helm, the Wolves had by far their greatest season in program history.

After winning another IAC Small School Championship, they went on to win their first-ever Section IV title and made it all the way to the New York State Class C Final Four. Along the ride, the Wolves were consistently one of the best teams both in the section and in New York, being ranked number one in the state in Class C throughout the year. At the end of it all, Union Springs finished 25-1, had five players named as IAC All-Stars and a further three to the All-State team. For his outstanding efforts guiding the program to unprecedented levels of prosperity, Kalet was named the Section IV Class C Girls Basketball Coach of the Year. It is our greatest honor to recognize ESPN Ithaca's Coach of the Year in a Girls Sport, Andy Kalet.







Coach of the Year in a Boys Sport

Joe Manning, Groton

As the 8-man football scene continues to grow throughout the state, Groton at the pinnacle of the sport, all under the direction of Joe Manning. In his fourth year as head coach, Manning helped build an unstoppable force on both sides of the ball.



A high-flying offense that averaged a staggering 45 points per game was balanced out by a suffocating defense that only allowed 13 points per game. Groton tore its way through the 8-man scene, going a perfect 10-0 against Section IV teams en route to the program's first sectional title since 2009. They then made it all the way to the state's first-ever 8-man regional championship, where their unforgettable season would end at 11-1 with four players being named to the NYSSWA 8-man All-State team. It is our greatest honor to recognize ESPN Ithaca's Coach of the Year in a Boys Sport, Joe Manning.





Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year

Hannah Nolan, Odessa-Montour

Without question, Hannah Nolan will go down as one of the greatest studentathletes in Odessa-Montour history. No matter the sport, Nolan has shattered school records left and right. Starting on the pitch, the captain was a goal scoring machine for the Grizzlies girls soccer team, holding the all-time goals record (86).



This fall was her magnum opus, scoring the most goals in a single season (26) and was a Fourth Team All-State selection. On the court, Nolan broke the girls basketball program mark for the most single-season steals (133) and career steals (305). She helped the Grizzlies win the IAC South Small Division title and was named as the division's MVP and a Fifth Team All-State selection. She also received the Elmira Basketball Officials' Sportsmanship Award for her exemplary conduct on the court. This spring, Nolan suited up for the outdoor track and field team for the first time since eighth grade, and she excelled right from the get-go. In their first meet of the season, the senior broke the school record in the triple jump. She also holds the program mark in the 400-meter hurdles and gualified for states in the pentathlon. Of her three sports, Nolan will continue her soccer career at SUNY Cortland. It is our honor to recognize Odessa-Montour's Hannah Nolan - ESPN Ithaca's Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year.







Brandon Vanacore, Southern Cayuga

This year, Brandon Vanacore played a massive role in deep playoff runs for multiple teams at Southern Cayuga. In the fall, the senior was the starting goalkeeper and captain for the boys soccer team. He was reliable as ever in goal, keeping 11 shutouts and coming up clutch time and time again.

Most notably, Vanacore made a key save during the Section IV Class D final in the penalty kick shootout, setting the Chiefs up for their first sectional title since 2003. They would go on to make the state semifinals for the first time in program history. For his heroics all season, Vanacore was named a Fourth Team All-State Selection and ended his career with over 400 saves. On the court, Vanacore helped turn around a program that went 4-12 the previous year. With his older brother Ryan at the helm as a firstyear head coach, the senior captain guided Southern Cayuga to the Section IV Class D final and finished 15-9. He also became the third player in program history to reach 1,000 career points. For the spring. Vanacore plays for the golf team, a sport that he picked up during the pandemic. Despite being fairly new to golf, Vanacore has excelled on the links, winning the 2022 IAC North Small Division MVP. It is our honor to recognize Southern Cayuga's Brandon Vanacore - ESPN Ithaca's Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

Nominations for Outstanding Scholar-Athletes and Outstanding Coaches come from the Athletic Directors of our 15 area high schools. Winners are selected based on a nomination and voting process by the Athletic Directors with the final decision made by the ESPN Ithaca Selection Committee.

Male and Female Scholar-Athletes of the Year

Each award winner has been recognized as a top varsity performer in at least two sports, while maintaining a minimum grade average of 85 with no disciplinary issues. The scholarathlete must be a high school senior, with strong academic and civic contributions.

Outstanding Scholar-Athletes

Each award winner has been recognized as a top varsity performer in their respective sport, while maintaining a minimum grade average of 80, with no disciplinary issues.

Outstanding Coaches and Coach of the Year

Each award winner has been recognized as a top varsity head coach for their sport for the entire season and is in good standing with their school and Section IV Athletics
